



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. The competition is open to all entrants 16 years of age and over, married or single, male or female;
2. Entrants must have a business or organisation as their sponsor;
3. Entry fee is \$155 per candidate paid to the Peninsula Chamber of Commerce
4. To be eligible to win the major prizes in the Queen of the Festival and Miss Charity Queen, candidates must raise a minimum of \$500 for the nominated charity, Cancer Council NSW 'Pink Ribbon Events.' Every dollar raised goes directly to your trust account with Cancer Council NSW.
5. The competition is NOT a beauty pageant. The judging is based on deportment, presentation, personality, community involvement and fundraising ability.
6. The title of Queen of the Oyster Festival 2010 will go to the entrant who has achieved the highest point score on the above criteria;
7. The title of Miss Charity Queen will go to the entrant who has raised the most funds for Cancer Council NSW 'Pink ribbon Events'
8. There are two judging events on separate dates throughout the month of October. One is a private interview before an independent panel of three judges and the second is an event such as a fashion parade or social event (to be confirmed)
9. The organising committee will assist entrants with fundraising ideas, media and opportunities.
10. All entrants will be required to attend the Festival Ball as our guest on Friday 12th November at the Ettalong Beach Club where the both Queens will be crowned.
11. The Festival is on Sunday 14th November at Ettalong beachfront and we ask all entrants to attend to be presented on the main stage at midday.
12. We also ask the 2010 Queen and Miss Charity Queen to attend the Festival Ball in November 2011 as our guest for the crowning of the queens;
13. All personal information, including contact details provided by the entrant is strictly confidential and will not be used without the express permission of the entrant.
